Basically, the PDE Comprehensive Plan is a school's "roadmap for success." It's a detailed plan that outlines how the school or district will improve student learning over the next few years. This plan is created with input from teachers, parents, and community members, and it focuses on things like:

- Identifying student needs: What are the biggest challenges facing our students?
- Setting goals: What do we want our students to achieve?
- Creating action plans: How will we help our students reach those goals?
- Tracking progress: Are we making a difference?

The graphic below represents a simplified, at a glance view of what the last planning committee identified as goals for PCS to focus on. Our professional learning sessions for teachers and all staff over the past three years have been guided by these high level desired outcomes, and there have been specific goals and action steps related to each of the descriptors.

Beginning in February and continuing through April there will be several Comprehensive Planning meetings scheduled immediately afterschool 4:00-5:30 pm. Dates are listed below.

Family members can participate virtually, although attending in person would be preferred, as groups will engage in various breakout sessions. I will host at least one virtual, parent/family only session in the middle of the process, so even if you cannot attend all of the other afterschool meetings, you can at least attend/listen in to the virtual session. At a minimum, all family members will be asked to complete a survey that will be an important part of the needs assessment.

- Social and Emotional Development: School provides opportunities for social interaction and emotional growth. Absences can limit these crucial experiences.

We understand that sometimes absences are unavoidable due to illness. However, please prioritize your child's education whenever possible.

Students have been showing perseverance working in the Makerspace by creating projects that tie in with the curriculum such as:


- <u>Second graders</u> are delving deeper into their Science lessons by creating plaster casts of fossils.

KEYNOTE ADDRESS Maryanne Wolf

"Deep Reading's Contributions to Humanity in a Digital Culture"

Maryanne Wolf is a scholar, teacher and advocate for children and literacy around the world. She is currently the director of the Center for Dyslexia, Diverse Learners and Social Justice at UCLA in the School of Education and Information Studies. She has written more than 170 scientific publications, including "Reader, Come Home: The Reading Brain in a Digital Culture" (12 translations; HarperCollins, 2018). Wolf is also the creator of the RAVE-O Intervention Program for all struggling readers and has received multiple awards for her contributions to the neuroscience of reading. Most recently, she was elected a permanent member of the Pontifical Academy of Science.


